DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Three Rivers on the 6th day of July 2024 is facing the imminent threat of widespread and severe damage, injury, and loss of life and property, resulting from the approaching storm "Hurricane Beryl", and

WHEREAS, I, Felipe Martinez, the Mayor of the City of Three Rivers, has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to ensure the safety, promote the health and well-being of people and to protect the Citizens of Three Rivers,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR, FELIPE MARTINEZ, OF THE CITY OF THREE RIVERS TEXAS:

- 1. That a local State of Emergency is hereby declared for the City of Three Rivers pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code.
- 2. Pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Government Code, the state of emergency shall continue for a period of not more than seven (7) days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the City Council or Mayor of the City of Three Rivers
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of emergency shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.
- 4. Pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of emergency activates the emergency management plan as adopted by the City of Three Rivers through the interjurisdictional agreement between the City of Three Rivers and Live Oak County.
- 5. That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
